We have had a lovely first week back. The sunshine has been most welcome at playtimes, it has been a joy watching the children playing together.

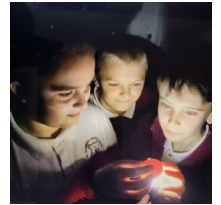

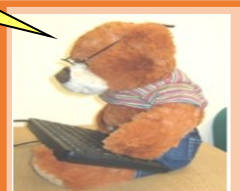
