Children will learn about the internet and how we use it. This draws on both positives and negatives of internet use, moving into children learning some basic rules to help them stay safe online. The children will also learn practical ways to stay safe inside and out, about bodily privacy (including the NSPCC PANTS message that 'privates are private') and the importance of talking to their 'special people' if anything troubles them.
