Throughout the Early Years curriculum, children are given opportunities to play and learn, be active and create and think critically.

Billy's Bucket Please Mr Magic Fish Splash Pupils will continue to develop their writing skills, letter formation, name writing and words/sentences containing the learned phonics sounds. They will learn to read and write labels, simple phrases and sentences linked to the topic of Seasides.	Please read with your child regularly and return books to school daily so that a new title can be issued. Encourage your child to read words in their environment and share stories to develop their language and literacy skills.
