



School Meals and Snacks

School meals can be booked online using our online service called Lunchshop.

School meals are provided free to children in EYFS and Key Stage 1 as part of the Universal Free School Meals programme and are varied, nutritious and well-balanced. For those in KS2, Years 3 to 6, meals are charged at £2.50 per day. Lunch money is paid using 'Lunchshop' which is our online lunch payment system. All School Meals are cooked fresh in our kitchen and provide a healthy, balanced and nutritional diet. A vegetarian option is included on the menu, if required.

You can, of course, provide a packed lunch as an alternative to School meals, but we recommend that they are healthy and balanced and contain no sweets, glass bottles or canned drinks.

A mid-morning healthy snack can be consumed at morning break. Healthy snacks can be purchased from the 'Tuck Shop' which is run by our School Council.

Personal Accident Insurance Cover

The provision of personal accident insurance is considered to be the responsibility of a child's parents.

The following two paragraphs are taken from a document issued by the County Council. Some parents mistakenly assume that if a child is injured at school the County Council is held responsible regardless of the circumstances and that its insurance will automatically apply.

'The County Council's responsibility is strictly limited to cases where there was negligence by them – or their staff. Accidents can happen in school, on the sports field, or during school visits, when the County Council or its staff are not in any way at fault and, therefore are not responsible.'

'Parents who are interested in personal accident insurance for their children can contact their own insurance broker.'

Attendance

If your child is unable to attend school, please let school know before 9.30 on the first day of absence. The minimum expected attendance in school is 95%.

For safety and daily routines, it is essential that the school has an up to date emergency contact number for illness and any possible accident. Please be aware that our Ofsted judgments are affected by school attendance.

Uniform

Our School Uniform, a visible expression of belonging to the family of St Cuthbert's is:

- Grey socks, black shoes/black trainer style shoes

- · White polo shirt with school crest
- Maroon sweatshirt or Cardigan with school crest
- · White socks, black shoes

P.E. KIT IN MAROON

Children should have maroon or black shorts, white t-shirts and trainers or plimsolls. P.E. kit available from school. Including a bag with school crest.)

FOR SWIMMING

Please remember all children will need a swimming cap.

JEWELLERY

For safety reasons children are discouraged from wearing jewellery at school. Pupils wearing earrings and other jewellery must remove them before taking part in PE or Games lessons. Watches should be given to the teacher in charge for safekeeping.

PURCHASING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

School uniform can be bought through our online uniform shop that can be found on the front page of our school website.

Homework

Regular homework tasks are given to all Key Stages. In most cases the homework is reading and tasks linked to the classroom activities in Numeracy and Literacy.

Taking an active interest in your child's homework is essential as it raises the status of homework and contributes to the child's feeling of achievement.

We encourage daily reading with questions to promote a love of books.



Friends of St Cuthbert's'

We have a flourishing Parents and Friends Association at St Cuthbert's called 'Friends of St Cuthbert's'. It is an organisation which has charitable status and is therefore able to apply for voluntary grants to support our School with different initiatives. All parents are welcome to take part in a variety of organised events, details of which are sent home at regular intervals in the 'Friday Newsletter'.
